Faith that prevails: Persistent Faith

Spend some time reading the passage from Luke 18: 35 – 43. Imagine what it was like to be the blind man as the crowd pass by. How would it feel? What would you be thinking? What would it be like to be called out by Jesus?

1. There was a sense of desperation for the blind man. He saw Jesus as his only hope. Do we see Jesus as our only hope and why do we sometimes settle for less?
2. How do we see persistent faith at work in this story? What can we learn about persistence in prayer? Have a look at vs. 1 – 8 for more on this.
3. The blind man was determined to meet Jesus and would let nothing get in his way. What tries to keep us back from pursuing our relationship with Jesus? What should be our response to these things?
4. If Jesus asked you the question, 'What do you want me to do for you?' what would your response be? Do you find that you limit your request? Why might that be?
5. Jesus restores physical sight, and he also restores spiritual vision. We have moments of revelation, when the Spirit of God shows us truth in a way that impacts our whole lives. Talk together about times when you have suddenly understood truth like this. What was the outcome for you and those around you?
